People who have used this toolkit have appreciated how the whole team ends up feeling that their individual skills are valued by everyone else.

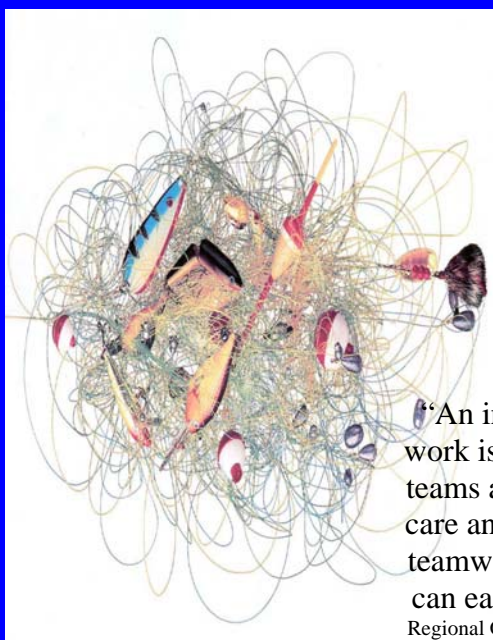
It supports the primary care team to take the initiative and design the service it wants to commission.
